### From the Rector's Desk

Here's a minimalist poem from one of my favorite Russian poets, Vsevolod Nekrasov. He was a dissident poet during the later Soviet period. He wrote very densely and cleverly about political and spiritual realities during the Cold War, when a lot people's perceptions and values were determined very much by Division and Polarization. Then it was about East and West in opposition. Much like our own times, though our divisions now come in different forms.

I've tried my best to translate his packed and seemingly simple language. It's harder than it looks! But I know it's not a perfect translation.

This poem is about something that goes beyond "this side" or "that side." And the poem's paradoxical transcendence of polarity has everything to do with the cold air we know a lot about in Wisconsin and the north. Maybe the simplicity and profundity of this poem can open us up to the possibility of another surprising and paradoxical something, beyond the divisions that would totalize all of our souls—the Word made flesh.



Used nesco roaster instead of frying pan and worked well (added water in bottom and water in nesco with hotdogs.) Jeff took hotdogs and served the outside and went over well. Dianna handed out Christmas candy, Pat and Paul handed out popcorn outside to guest as well. For brownies we had a lot left over 1 pan of mint brownies for new year would be enough.
