## Here is the Love INC update

Thank you to all who donated so generously to our product collection in August and to those who continue to bring items for use, specifically by our immigrant neighbors. Know that everything will always be appreciated.

On Saturday, September 21, Love INC sponsored the COPE event--the Cost of Poverty Experience. This was a simulated month of the life of a low-income family.



Approximately 30 people participated in the experience, which included role-playing, task completion, and time limitations. Pat Sather had the role of a 5-year-old child with hyperactivity and ADHD traits. In her role, she screamed, cried, and did everything possible to make it difficult for her role-playing "parents" to accomplish their daily tasks. Her "parents" both worked, so at times, one had to stay home from work to take care of her, or they had to find babysitters when they needed to keep appointments to apply for benefits or programs to help the family. Even though both parents were working full-time, they had a tough time covering expenses.

Pat found the lack of transportation a major life problem. Reliance on public transport with timetables and shutdown times is not easy, especially if handling children and boxes of food.

The main request from the participants who have had actual experience of low-income included a plea to always address the person and not the need—to acknowledge the human person before the condition.

## Guild of Saint Alban Update

Much of the work of the guild is centered on walking alongside refugees as they build up their new lives in America.

Along that journey, some of our members have noticed that the refugees have been in-need of household items, clothes, etc., that have not been readily available from the existing supply that comes from the overall resettlement effort.



I often encourage the guild to think beyond the frequent requests that typically come and explore how our offering of love can be deepened. The recognition of this need is a great example of that awareness and I am thankful that the members of the guild are embodying what is possible with this ministry.

To support this awareness, we are re-purposing the nursery located downstairs to hold an inventory of items that the guild believes will enrich the lives of the refugees. Here is a list of what would help: kitchen items(tableware, dishes, pots and pans, mixing bowls, utensils, etc.), bath towels, bed sheets, alarm clock, paper, pens, pencils, toiletries, cleaning supplies, microwave, clothing iron, and clothes.

For the clothing sizes, we can share specifics once we know the family's sizes. If you have lightly used items or are willing to go shopping and donate then please let Deacon Paul know and we can coordinate getting them into downstairs.
