Angelus

The Angelus is the ancient prayer of the Church which recalls the Incarnation of our Lord and Our Lady's faithful cooperation with God. Traditionally it is rung three times during the day to cause God's people to remember the Incarnation as they hear it ring. It traditionally rings at 7:00 a.m., Noon, and 5:00 p.m. at Grace Church.

People *Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.*

Officiant And the Word was made flesh.

People *And dwelt among us.*

Officiant Hail, Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus.

People *Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.*

Officiant Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God.

People *That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.*

Officiant Let us pray. We beseech thee, O Lord, pour thy grace into our hearts; that as we have known the Incarnation of thy Son, Jesus Christ, by the message of an angel, so by † His Cross and Passion we may be brought unto the glory of His resurrection; though the same Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

Lord Jesus Christ, you said to your apostles, "Peace I give to you; my own peace I leave with you:" Regard not our sins, but the faith of your Church, and give to us the peace and unity of that heavenly City, where with the Father and the Holy Spirit you live and reign, now and for ever. *Amen.*
